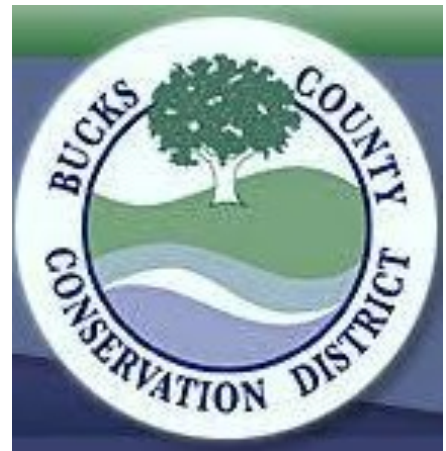
Notice from the Bucks County Conservation District

Looking to apply conservation best management practices on your farm?

Have concerns regarding manure management, animal concentration areas, streambank erosion and/or soil erosion?

Consider applying for the brand-new Agricultural Conservation Assistance Program (ACAP) while funds last!

- The Agricultural Conservation Assistance Program (ACAP) will provide a true statewide cost-share program to help implement practices that keep healthy soils and nutrients on their land and out of waterways. The Bucks County Conservation District will reimburse up to 90% of the project implementation costs!
- Eligible projects must be included in an Ag E&S Plan/Conservation Plan and/or Manure Management Plan/Nutrient Management Plan and shall control nitrogen, phosphorus, and/or sediment on the farm.
- The District recommends requesting assistance from the BCCD or a private consultant as the application requires preliminary design and cost estimates.

Farm Bureau Attends Governor's Budget Address, Luncheon; Joins CCAP Ag Advisory Committee

Farm Bureau Regulatory Affairs Specialist Grant Gulibon represented PFB at the Governor's Budget Address (and subsequent luncheon) on March 7. He has also joined the County Commissioners Association of PA (CCAP) Agricultural Advisory Committee for 2023 and participated in its first meeting on March 10, which included a briefing from PDA Secretary Russell Redding on HPAI, ACAP, dairy processing, solar siting issues, and farmland preservation. The CCAP policy resolutions process will be taking place in late May/early June of this year, and PFB will provide input on its priorities as it takes place.

PDA Governor's Invasive Species Council Meets

The Governor's Invasive Species Council, on which Farm Bureau is represented, met on March 16 at PDA. Discussion items included a presentation on "inclusive language" for naming and talking about invasive species; an overview of the results of the first Pennsylvania Invasive Species Impacts Survey and activities related to the PRISM pilot program in northwestern Pennsylvania; and next steps regarding expanding PRISM around the state. PDA program staff have been invited to present on PRISM at the upcoming Farm Bureau NER Committee meeting.

EPA Ag Worker Protection Standard (WPS) Proposed for Reversion to 2015 Rule; PDA Pesticide Advisory Board Meets

On Feb. 16, EPA announced that it is proposing to return to 2015 requirements for application exclusion zones, or AEZ, for applying pesticides. The Worker Protection Standard (WPS) regulations "are designed to protect ag workers from exposure to pesticides." EPA is calling for returning to several 2015 provisions as well as maintaining some aspects of the 2020 rule. There is a 60-day public comment period currently open at [regulations.gov](https://www.regulations.gov), ending May 12.

In 2020, the Trump Administration published a rule that reduced the size of AEZ on agricultural employers' property from 100 feet to 25 feet for some ground-based spray applications. Prior to the effective date of the 2020 AEZ rule, petitions were filed in the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of New York and in the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Second Circuit challenging the 2020 rule. The federal court in New York issued a temporary restraining order against the rule that never took effect. As a result, the AEZ provisions in the 2015 rule remain in effect.

Farm Bureau submitted extensive comments on the 2015 requirements and will do so again on this proposal. Those interested in commenting should contact Grant Gulibon, Farm Bureau Regulatory Affairs Specialist, at rgulibon@pfb.com.

The PDA Pesticide Advisory Board (PAB) held its initial 2023 meeting on March 9. Discussion topics included an overview of potential rodenticide labeling changes and updates from PDA on its regulatory, registration, enforcement, and other activities.

ENERGY

House Passed Lower Energy Costs Act

On March 30th, the House passed H.R.1, the *Lower Energy Costs Act* with a bipartisan vote of 225-204. The bill would address high energy costs by increasing the production of American energy and reducing regulatory burdens through comprehensive permitting reform. Farm Bureau supports H.R. 1.

DAIRY

Whole Milk for Healthy Kids Act

Representatives “GT” Thompson (R-PA) and Kim Schrier (D-WA) introduced [H.R.1147](#), the *Whole Milk for Healthy Kids Act*. The bill would allow whole, reduced-fat, low-fat, and fat-free flavored and unflavored milk in school cafeterias. Current PA co-sponsors are Representatives Cartwright, Meuser, Perry, Smucker, Joyce, Reschenthaler, and Kelly.

DAIRY PRIDE Act

Senator Tammy Baldwin (D-WI) and Representative John Joyce (R-PA) introduced [S.549/H.R.1462](#), the *Defending Against Imitations and Replacements of Yogurt, Milk, and Cheese to Promote Regular Intake of Dairy Everyday Act or the DAIRY PRIDE Act*. The bill would prohibit the sale of any food that uses the market name of a dairy product (such as milk, yogurt, or cream cheese) unless the food (1) is the milk of a hooved animal, (2) is derived from such milk, or (3) contains such milk as a primary ingredient. Current PA co-sponsors are Representatives Cartwright, Meuser, and Thompson.

The DAIRY PRIDE Act is especially important after the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) issued a draft milk guidance on February 22, 2023, that would allow for nut- or plant-based dairy beverages to be labeled as milk. PFB will be submitting comments to FDA on the guidance.

Ask your U.S. House Member and U.S. Senators to co-sponsor the bipartisan DAIRY PRIDE Act of 2023.

Dairy Pricing Opportunity Act

Representatives Nick Langworthy (R-NY) and Joe Morelle (D-NY) introduced the [Dairy Pricing Opportunity Act](#). The bill would initiate a Federal Order Hearing within 180 days in addition to giving USDA the needed authority to cost survey dairy product manufacturers. It is hoped for this bill to be included in the 2023 Farm Bill. The current PA co-sponsor is Representative Meuser. Senator Kirsten Gillibrand (D-NY) plans to introduce companion legislation in the near future.

APPROPRIATIONS & BUDGET

PDA and PFB’s FY24 Appropriations Request

On March 16th, the Biden Administration released its \$6.9 trillion dollar Budget Request for Fiscal Year 2024 (FY24). PA Department of Agriculture (PDA) and PFB led an appropriations request for FY24 asking for the following language to be included in the report: *“The Committee is deeply concerned by the spread of Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza. The Committee encourages the Secretary of Agriculture to direct the Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service’s Veterinary Services to provide increased training, public outreach, and educational materials to areas threatened by highly pathogenic avian influenza.”* The request was sent to PA’s U.S. House and Senate members. We have had positive feedback and many members of our delegation submitted the request to the Appropriations Committee.

AFBF’s FY24 Agriculture Appropriations Statement

On March 29th, AFBF submitted its statement for the record to the House and Senate Appropriations Subcommittees on Agriculture regarding funding priorities for Fiscal Year 2024.

TRADE

U.S. and Canada Dairy Dispute in the USMCA

The U.S. has established a second U.S.-Mexico-Canada Agreement (USMCA) dispute panel with Canada over their application of tariff-rate quotas (TRQs) for dairy products. The issue remains that Canada is not following the decision of the December 2021 USMCA dispute settlement panel, where the U.S. won. The panel ruled that Canada violated the terms of the USMCA by restricting access to its market for U.S. dairy products with inconsistent TRQ measurements. Farm Bureau supports using the enforcement measures in USMCA to reach the negotiated access to Canadian markets for U.S. dairy products. Update on Mexican Biotech Corn

In late 2020, Mexico published a presidential decree on genetically modified (GMO) corn stating that it would ban GMO corn from the country's diet and end the use of glyphosate by January 31, 2024. Consequently, U.S. corn exports were dramatically impacted. To put it into perspective, the U.S. exported 13.8 million tons of yellow corn and 1.6 million tons of white corn to Mexico in 2022. This is the largest foreign market for U.S. corn. In February 2023, another decree was published allowing for the import of yellow corn, produced with biotechnology. However, certain U.S. corn (white corn) produced with biotechnology, is still not being imported. On March 6th, the Office of the U.S. Trade Representative (USTR) announced consultations with Mexico under the U.S.-Mexico-Canada Agreement (USMCA) concerning this issue. If there is no resolution, the U.S. can call for a dispute panel to decide the issues.

SUSTAINABILITY / CLIMATE

Protect Farmers from the SEC Act

On February 14th, Senators John Boozman (R-AR) and Mike Braun (R-IN) along with Representative Frank Lucas (R-OK) re-introduced the *Protect Farmers from the SEC Act* in both chambers. This was prompted by the SEC's proposed "[Enhancement and Standardization of Climate-Related Disclosures](#)" rule, which is expected to be finalized in April. AFBF has compliancy, privacy, small business, and liability concerns in addition to an overreach of Congress. The *Protect Farmers from the SEC Act* would prohibit the SEC from requiring farms to report Scope 3 greenhouse gas emissions.

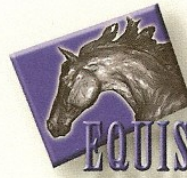
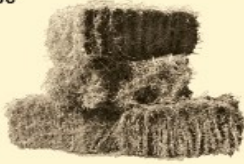
