On Monday, June 5, 2023, the Harmony Fire District was given a grain silo rescue tube from the Butler County Farm Bureau

Farm bureau representatives James Thiele, President, Evelyn Minteer, Vice President and James Boldy, Director and Jim and Linda Halstead Co-Secretaries presented the rescue tube and a \$1,000 check for training in it's use, with money raised by the Women's Leadership Committee.

The rescue tube is the fourth that the bureau has purchased for volunteer fire departments in the county. The others have been given to the Prospect, North Washington and Saxonburg volunteer fire departments.



On Thursday, May 25, Summit Elementary School was presented with the 2023 Partnership in Agricultural Literacy Award. The National Agriculture in the Classroom Organization honored the Community Agricultural Partnership at Summit (CAPS) in front of excited students, parents, teachers and faculty in the outdoor classroom.

Speaking at the award ceremony was Chris Hoffman, president of the Pennsylvania Farm Bureau and chairman of the Pennsylvania Friends of Agriculture Foundation.

"These dedicated individuals have built a program that, with the right leadership and commitment, could be replicated at other schools," Shupp Espenshade said.

And while this national recognized award does bring a level of prestige to Summit Elementary, the goal is clear — teaching students important skills for the future.

"To see a group of teachers and administrators looking at agriculture, the food that we eat and learning how we can get our children to engage them in the learning process," Hoffman said. "These are skills that people need to know."

#### **Policy Developement**

#### Policy development is the most important activity of the county Farm Bureau.

It is an organized and on-going program of gathering ideas and opinions from the members. The county Policy Development Committee is responsible for editing, compiling, clarifying and submitting these ideas for discussion and action at the county annual meeting.

Resolutions on state and national issues that are suggested by the majority of voting members at the county annual meeting are submitted to the state Policy Development Committee, and resolutions passed concerning local issues become county policy. The State Policy Development Committee then decides, by majority vote, which ideas are to be submitted as resolutions to the voting delegates at the PFB annual meeting. The voting delegates then decide, by majority vote, which resolutions are to be adopted as PFB policy.

These resolutions are published in an official policy book for the year and policies that are of national interest are then submitted to the American Farm Bureau Federation (AFBF) Resolution Committee and voted on by voting delegates at the AFBF annual meeting. Adopted resolutions are then published after the annual meeting in the AFBF policy book.
