




Save the Date!

The Young Ag Professionals' branch of the Fulton County Farm Bureau hosted its first-ever district event this summer drawing in farmers and officials from a four-county area.

County Young Ag Professional (YAP) co-chairs Amber Brant and Olivia Buchheit along with senior co-chair Logan Fraker organized a summer, family picnic at Cowans Gap State Park on June 11 that was open to YAP District 9 members from Fulton, Franklin, Cumberland and Adams counties. YAP is a Pennsylvania Farm Bureau leadership program open to individuals and couples between the ages of 18 and 35 to preserve farming and expand ag-related opportunities.

The picnic drew in around three dozen attendees, including YAP members from Fulton, Franklin and Cumberland counties. On hand were District 9 state directors Andrea and Ryan Brown from Cumberland County; Suzanne Shea, District 9 director for the state Women's Leadership Committee; Fulton County Farm Bureau President Kevin Mountz; various county board members; and county general membership.

"The first YAP summer picnic far exceeded our expectations and the goals that we, as co-chairs, set for how we would like the YAP to grow here in Fulton County," Brant stated. "We intend to make it an annual tradition and a fun, relaxing break for our county farmers as well as neighboring county farmers."

In addition to delicious food, fellowship, raffles, cornhole and games for kids and adults, Shea offered a soil demonstration for those on hand.

The county YAP program officially kicked off here earlier this year and included a meet and greet at Ice Fest in Chambersburg for local members and this family picnic, which was funded by a Marianna hoagie and pizza fundraiser and a Growing Communities Grant through the Pennsylvania Farm Bureau. Plans are already under way for next year's picnic.

The YAP group has also notably been out and about visiting area farmers markets with baby goat snuggling and had planned to lend a helping hand at the county Farm Bureau's first-ever blood drive.
