"PFB To Replace Mobile Ag Lab"

One of the educational tools we have available to our county is the Mobile Agriculture Education and Science Lab. The lab is a 40-foot mobile classroom that travels across the state bringing an

interactive experience directly to students in grades K-8. The Mobile Ag Lab is equipped with over 30 STEM-based science experiments and lessons, a certified teacher, and all the supplies needed for hands-on learning. Each science experiment is designed to emphasize a different aspect of agriculture, including commodities, the environment, biotechnology, food and fiber. Each lesson focuses on increasing student knowledge on the importance of agriculture and its impact on their daily lives.

PFB plans to retire one of the current labs and purchase a new one. The labs have been used by over 2 million students over the last 12 years. As you can imagine, these are very costly to replace. Even though a major portion is funded by grant monies, we still need to raise about \$70,000 to complete the purchase.

The "Farms to Families" mobile trailer is an educational experience for both children and those just young at heart. With lots of trivia, games and hands-on learning, the lab teaches visitors about Pennsylvania farming, soil conservation and health, food production and how to create a balanced meal utilizing foods grown right here in the commonwealth.

Perhaps the most unique feature of the lab is the virtual tractor ride that is enjoyed by both kids and adults alike. Donning a pair of virtual reality goggles, folks can enjoy firsthand driving a combine through a soybean field. Don't forget to keep an eye out for the cart operator!

Pennsylvania farms currently featured in the immersion lab include aquaponics with BrightFarms; Painterland Farms, an organic, regenerative dairy farm; Lazy Hog Farm; and mushrooms through Buono Farms.

The lab will be onsite at the fair and open eight hours daily Monday through Friday, in conjunction with arrangements and coordination through the Fulton County Fair Board.

Of those 16 districts, six members are new. My district includes Adams, Cumberland, Franklin and Fulton counties. Training included our state by-laws, PFB structure and organization, member relations, employment practices, employee engagement, Friends of Agriculture Foundation, governance and fiduciary responsibilities, financial reports, and government affairs and communications division.

The following two days our first state board directors' meeting of 2024 took place. Here are just a few highlights of that meeting:

*We reviewed the treasurer's report for the period ending December 31, 2023. You can rest assured that your state farm bureau is financially stable, and your membership funds are managed with sound fiscal practices.

*The member relations report revealed we are about 300 new members ahead of last year statewide. However, we are currently behind in renewals. That is just a reminder that we all need to do our part and keep our membership renewals current.

*We reviewed the 2024 priority issues that were submitted by county farm bureaus and received a report regarding the AFBF annual meeting.

*I am pleased to inform you the PFB received the Pinnacle award for 2023. This award recognizes excellence in implementation of outstanding member programs and membership achievements. *Bryan Burhans, executive director of the PA Game Commission, met with us and discussed current wildlife issues
