

The following interview highlights Jim Fuller, a long-time cattle farmer in Perry County.

How long have you been farming?

Fuller: I've been farming for over fifty years. My wife and I had a trailer in Newport where we kept some chickens, pigs, and a couple bull calves. This would help us cut down our grocery bills.

How many head of cattle do you raise?

F: As of this summer, I raise forty-four head of cattle; twenty-one cows and a bull, plus twenty-two calves.

What do you enjoy the most about raising cattle?

F: Seeing a newborn, healthy calf. I also enjoy incubating guinea eggs. I can fit seventy to eighty eggs in one incubator. Now I have around 350 guineas.

How have you seen agriculture change over the past fifty years?

F: Farming has gotten easier than what it's been. The US has good economic conditions; it gives us the ability to raise animals and crops to sell them at a decent price. When the economy is good, farming is good. If you can manage a farm well, you can make profit off of it. In the past I struggled to make ends meet. I raise to sell, taking care not to get taken.

What advice would you give for anyone interested in pursuing farming?

F: Examine your work ethic. If you're looking to get rich quickly and easily, then this business is not for you. Patience is key. Learn from your past mistakes. Sometimes it is worth it to borrow money if it can help make your life easier, as long as you pay it back as soon as you can. Work smarter-not harder.

2024 Annual Meeting

The Perry County Farm Bureau annual meeting was held on October 10th of this year. The meeting was held at the Duncannon EMS building. We had around fifty farm bureau members attend along with various speakers. Many topics were brought up which sparked discussion among various members of the bureau.
