Awards were handed out to distinguished farmers, educational seminars for many to attend and of course an important election. This year Chris Hoffman, Juanita County farmer was re-elected to another 2 year term as President of Pa Farm Bureau. We wish Chris all the best in this position representing all of us.

As in every Annual get together the most important is accomplishing what our grassroots association is all about, namely policies. Jim Barbour, William Shay, Dave DeLeon and Mike Russell Jr all took their turn on the delegate floor representing Susquehanna County on the 3 seats based on our membership.

As last year's policies proved to be, once again many focused on wildlife and aiding farmers dealing with crop damage. The policies our county's membership approved at our own county annual dinner meeting did particularly well. Summarizing, our policies allowing a two thirds majority vote on the floor of both the US and State House and Senate to move bills out of committee, PA Game Commission creating a culling program of deer in areas of high population and crop damage and Conversation projects built for Heavy Use Protection including roofs not be taxed. We hope to see some of what was approved in Hershey have legislative approval going forward.

We appreciate those who are working on our behalf and looking forward to meeting new and interesting people going forward to help achieve our goal of 25% return on action requests.
