A Note from the County President

Sometimes good things take time.

Such is the case with York County's effort to quantify the amount of agricultural pollutants flowing into the Susquehanna River and Chesapeake Bay. In 2019, the County was told by PA DEP that their models indicated we were the 2nd largest polluter of the Bay, with the not-so-vague implication that more regulations were coming. The County Commissioners at the time took the bold action of working with the US Geological Service to fund and install stream monitors on our major tributaries to determine whether there was any truth in the DEP allegations.

After 5 years of monitoring, the results are in. Turns out we are doing quite well, with sediment nearly 10 times lower than expected, and nitrogen and phosphorus well below the assumed levels.

Our stream monitors are the first in the nation providing real time cumulative tracking, and they are providing good news for farmers. I hope that environmental advocates and regulators see it as good news as well. These positive results cannot and should not be dismissed by those who might be disappointed to learn that farmers aren't the problem they have been made out to be. Maybe they can use the real time results to improve those models.

This project is a great example of local government doing the right thing at the right time. The next time you see one of our County Commissioners, thank them for taking a chance on farmers.



Earth Day in York County

In order to celebrate Earth Day in York County this year on April 22, the York County Commissioners held a press conference announcing the results of a first-of-its-kind water quality monitoring program!

York County officials announced the county's water pollutant levels are significantly lower than initially reported by the state, according to data from the county's 10-year Water Quality Monitoring initiative – the first of its kind in the state and the nation.

"We are the first county in Pennsylvania and the entire nation to undertake this kind of innovative water quality monitoring program," said York County President Commissioner Julie Wheeler. "Here in York County, we pride ourselves on the responsible stewardship of our precious land and waterways."

"As part of its ongoing efforts to reduce pollutant levels in the Susquehanna River and Chesapeake Bay watershed, York County has engaged community stakeholders, such as the county's farmers, the York County Conservation District and others, working together to develop solutions.

The differences in the nitrogen data were also significant, with DEP's computer-generated data showing nearly 12 million pounds of nitrogen in York County waterways while the real-time data developed by the county showed a four-year average of just 7.2 million pounds – or 60 percent of the levels reported by DEP.

Phosphorus levels also were less under the real-time water quality monitoring done by the county and USGS, with the four-year average being 370,064 pounds of phosphorus compared with the DEP's reported 446,995 pounds – a roughly 17 percent difference.

"We have long suspected that the water pollutant numbers reported by DEP were not accurate, and we now have the data that shows we were correct," said Wade Gobrecht, director of the York County Planning Commission. "Through this first-of-its-kind

with the USGS,
we have realtime data collected over a
four-year
timeframe,
which show unequivocally that
our waterways
are cleaner than

what had previously been reported. Moving forward, we believe this approach will ensure we are relying on accurate data to help drive our water quality improvement efforts."

York County Farm Bureau President Barron Shaw was invited to speak on water quality. Here is his statement:

My name is Barron Shaw, and I am the President of the York County Farm Bureau.

As a 7th generation farmer on the same piece of property, I identify myself first as a steward of my land. I work hard to prevent erosion, improve its fertility, and value its biodiversity. No farmer wants to see his topsoil wash downstream, nor waste valuable money on nutrients that are not needed or are leached away before they are used. Farmers are highly invested in the ecology of their land.

The results you've seen today are good news for York County farmers and all residents of York County. I hope that environmental advocates and regulators see it as good news as well. These positive results cannot and should not be dismissed by those who might be disappointed to learn that farmers aren't the problem they have been made out to be.

Instead, it is a great opportunity for those who develop these complicated models to look more closely at their assumptions, data, and algorithms. We hope they work with us to find out why we are doing so much better than expected. If there is something we are doing well, then perhaps it can be replicated elsewhere.

Whatever is found, the good news is that the stream monitors will continue to provide data in order to help validate future improved versions of the models. Public trust will depend on that.

Many people today have become cynical about the government's role in our daily lives. But the project you've heard about today is a great example of local government doing the right thing at the right time. On behalf of the York County Farm Bureau I'd like to thank the York County Commissioner's for their work on this project over the last 5 years.

Kennard-Dale FFA Barn is Open!

Kennard-Dale FFA's new barn is officially open! York County President Barron Shaw & State Board member Julie Schrum were able to meet with FFA Director Hanna Harris for a walk through! The barn is 54'x60'. The idea came to Miss Harris when she began at Kennard-Dale 5 years ago. They already have a wonderful greenhouse and aquaponic system for the plant and natural rescoure classes, but were missing the animal section. What a great opportunity the students will now have with animals as a result of this new endeavor. There are 2 pygmy goats (Kenna & Dale) residing here and a cow has recently appeared thanks to a loaned donation! There are two pastures where the animals can graze. Some questions asked of Miss Harris on the topic: How will you choose what student will get the job of taking care of the animals over the summer when the time does come? There will be an interview process as this is expected to be a paid position for a student. They will have to apply and interview with myself and possibly other individuals. This is a serious job as the lives of the plants and animals will be greatly affected by the person caring for them. I will still be heavily involved but this student will see and care for them a lot over the summer.

If anyone is willing to loan or purchase animals for the students to take care of at the barn, as well as purchase or provide veterinary services, it would be greatly appreciated! 
