
The agenda this year has changed a but from years past in our transition to a new format coming in 2024. The event will be held Sunday, November 12— Wednesday, November 15. `Ag Labor Update

HIRE Act: Representatives Tony Gonzales (R-TX) and Henry Cuellar (D-TX) introduced the *H-2 Improvements to Relieve Employers (HIRE) Act.* This bill would codify visa interview waiver authority for H-2 workers and extend the validity of a company's visa petitions and labor certifications. PFB is in support and asking for co-sponsors.

House Agriculture Committee's Ag Labor Working Group Stakeholder Survey: On June 21st, Chairman "GT" Thompson and Ranking Member David Scott announced the Committee's bi-partisan Agricultural Labor Working Group. The working group's purpose is to collect input from the agricultural workforce on problems with the current H-2A program, then submit a report to the full committee with their findings on a possible legislative solution based on recommendations from stakeholders. Due to House rules, they have a deadline of 6 months (December 2023). You are encouraged to complete this stakeholder survey: https:// agriculture.house.gov/policy/agricultural-laborworking-group.htm The working group has not published a deadline for the survey.

Member Spotlight:

Clover Creek Farm LLC & Young's Farm Service

Clover Creek Farm LLC is owned and operated by Trent & Nicki Young in Brogue, PA. They raise angus cattle, as well as corn, soybeans, rye, and alfalfa & grass hay.

Back in 2018, they started with just a few steers to finish for friends, family, and to have their own beef stocked in the freezer. Through word of mouth, the

interest grew with others that had the same idea of wanting fresh local beef and knowing where the beef came from, how it was raised, etc. Around the same time, they also purchased a few cow/calf pairs to start their cow herd. Through Select Sires A.I., they've chosen high quality genetics that focus on carcass merit, growth, and marbling, as well as calving ease, and continue to grow their cow herd by keeping back several heifers each year. They have plans to expand their pasture area and implement a better rotational grazing system for the coming year.

Clover Creek Farm sells freezer beef yearround by the 1/4, 1/2 or whole. Individual cuts and custom beef bundles are available for pick up at the

farm. Their beef is processed at a USDA inspected butcher in Mount Joy, PA. They enjoy sharing recipes with their customers and introducing them to new cuts they may not have tried before and ways to use them. And you can also find their beef on the menu at the Dandelion Thyme food truck!

Trent & Nicki run a repair shop on the farm as well. Young's Farm Service & Repair LLC opened in 2011. It's a "jack of all trades" type shop serving the local community whether it be a personal vehicle inspection or maintenance, a farm tractor repair, something that needs welded, you name it. Their main specialty is in diesel repair & performance. Some of their work on customer trucks has been featured in Diesel World and Ultimate Diesel Builders Guide magazines. If you have something in need of repair, be sure to stop by and see Trent & Christopher in the shop!

York County Legislative Breakfast

On Tuesday, September 19, members of York County Farm Bureau Board, local farmers, and our local legislators met at 2 Brothers Restaurant in York to discuss what was happening at the Capitol as well as current issues facing agriculture. Among the topics discussed were DEP permitting, regulations surrounding the use of drones in agriculture, cover



crop funding, deer damage and solutions for a better red tag system, continued funding for High Path Avian Influenza, recent bridge closures, and the proposed

York Energy Storage Hydroelectric project. Representatives Seth Grove of the 196th district and Mike Jones of the 93rd District gave an update on the current budget explaining that the main part of the budget is passed, that they are just working on codefining budget bills. Also in attendance was County Commissioner

Doug Hoke, Representative Carol Hill-Evans of the 95th district and staff from Senator Regans office.

- 3. We oppose any government regulation or mandates which reduce agricultural operations; livestock numbers or land use acreage. Submitted Pattie McCandless
