A WOTUS Win!

In Sackett v. EPA, the United States Supreme Court finally ruled that the EPA and the Army Corps of Engineers wrongfully claimed oversight on wetlands owned by Chantell and Michael Sackett. The verdict was issued on Thursday, May 25. The Court ruled unanimously, 9-0, that the Clean Water Act did not apply to the wetlands on the Sacketts' property, striking down the "significant nexus" test in determining what is considered a Waters of the United States (WOTUS).

Additionally, by a 5-4 vote, the Court adopted a more stringent test for what qualifies as an "adjacent wetland" subject to the Clean Water Act jurisdiction. Writing for the majority, Justice Alito concluded that the Clean Water Act applies to wetlands that are "as a practical matter indistinguishable from waters of the United States" because they have a "continuous surface connection" with a larger body of water.

The decision will have positive, far-reaching consequences for those in the agricultural industry. Pennsylvania Farm Bureau President Chris Hoffman commented on the U.S. Supreme Court ruling in *Sackett v. EPA*: "It's a good day for Pennsylvania agriculture. We thank the Supreme Court for giving farmers clarity about how they manage their land," Hoffman said. "We need a common-sense rule that works for agriculture and helps farmers do their job and protects water quality. We're grateful that the Court acted to rein in the huge overreach of the authority of the EPA and Army Corps of Engineers. The decision in *Sackett v. EPA* is as a win for our farmers, who protect their soil, air and water every day, as their legacy to the next generation."

American Farm Bureau Federation President Zippy Duvall shared the sentiment. "AFBF appreciates the Supreme Court justices for their careful consideration of the implications of *Sackett v. EPA*. The EPA clearly overstepped its authority under the Clean Water Act by restricting private property owners from developing their land despite being far from the nearest navigable water. "The justices respect private property rights. It's now time for the Biden administration to do the same and rewrite the Waters of the United States rule. Farmers and ranchers share the goal of protecting the resources they're entrusted with, but they deserve a rule that provides clarity and doesn't require a team of attorneys to properly care for their land."

U.S. Congressman and Chairman of the House Committee on Agriculture Glenn "GT" Thompson added the following thoughts on the current WOTUS rule. "(Thursday's) unanimous ruling in Sackett v EPA is a victory for America's farmers, ranchers, and landowners. The decision reaffirms the rights of property owners and provides long-needed clarity to rural America. In light of this decision, the Biden Administration should withdraw its flawed final WOTUS rule.

2023 Farm Bill

The farm bill is the most significant piece of legislation that affects farmers and ranchers across the country. It plays a critical role in protecting farmers' livelihoods and making sure Americans have safe, nutritious food, including by supporting those facing hunger. The farm bill gives farmers and ranchers the tools they need to keep our farms and food supply secure in all seasons.

The farm bill funds nutrition programs like SNAP, formerly known as food stamps, as well as programs that support the U.S. agricultural sector, such as risk management, agricultural research and conservation programs.

There are 260 lawmakers that are NEW to farm bill this year. The goal is to have a unified farm bill with farm and nutrition programs that meet the needs of producers, processors, and consumers in rural and urban communities. The farm bill is reauthorized every five years. The current farm bill expires on September 30, 2023. The projected Farm Bill is set at a \$1.5 Trillion budget with Nutrition having 81%, Crop Insurance 7%, Inflation Reduction Act 2%, Conservation Programs 4%, Commodity Programs 5% and Other at 1%. Congress must pass a farm bill *this year* in order to fully protect our food, land and livelihoods. Farm Bureau is working hard to make sure our ASK is being heard!



As soon as the Christmas season is over, January and February are the months to clean up from the season, winterize the equipment, and plan for the year. March and April are always busy, clearing old stumps from the field, planting the new seedlings, and implementing weed management strategies. Many times May is full of mowing, nurturing the seedlings, and disease/insect management. June typically brings the need to supplement water for the trees, beginning shearing the trees, and continued weed/insect/disease management. July is busy finishing the shearing, more watering, and lots of mowing. August looks similar to June and July, but in addition it's time to order next year's seedling order. September and October slow down, but depending on the weather it could be a continuation of management strategies, mowing, and watering the seedlings. November quickly arrives and brings prepping the equipment, setting up the shop, digging trees, making wreaths, garland, and opening up for the season! 
