# Legislative Breakfast Draws Attention to Key Issues

Several members of the CVF Board met with county, state and federal legislators on February 11 over breakfast.

Governmental Relations Director, Bud Wills welcomed the participants and handed out papers outlining the public policy directives



that are the priority focus in 2022. The state issues include meat processing, storm and clean water solutions, dairy, transportation, minimum royalty and Lyme disease. Federal issues include water/WOTUS and labor/immigration. Detailed information on each of these subjects can be obtained from Bud.

Legislators present included 21<sup>st</sup> District State Senator, Scott Hutchinson, 63<sup>rd</sup> District State Representative Donna Oberlander, Brad Moore, District Director for Senator Glenn "GT" Thompson, Clarion County Commissioners, Ed Heasley, Ted Tharan and Wayne Brosius, Venango County Commissioners Chip Abramovic and Mike Dulaney, and Forest County Commissioner Mark Kingston.

Senator Hutchinson spoke about the current




budget being proposed by the governor as being a "recipe for disaster" because they would use one-time federal funds for things that could not be supported in the future without those funds. He also said that people in Ag need tax changes in depreciation expenses and in lifetime farm exchanges.

Representative Oberlander addressed, among other things, the importance of getting more meat processing plants in our region and the bridge tolling issues. She is also working to introduce transportation legislation to increase weight limits and reduce permitting on wider loads.

Clarion County Commissioner Ted Tharan talked about the new Solar & Wind Ordinance in Clarion County that requires bonds to be in place to create solar and wind fields. He also talked about the need for property reassessment in Clarion County. It has been 75 years since properties were assessed and that there are many inequities that need to be addressed.

Forest County Commissioner Mark Kingston talked about the improvements in broadband services and in EMS services in the county. They are getting two new ambulances and will be training approximately 20 new EMTs.


