### SWEET CORN FACTS

The average ear of corn has 800 kernels in 16 rows.

- 1. Only 1% of corn planted in the United States is sweet corn.
- 2. Corn cobs always have an even number of rows.
- 3. The types of corn grown in America are dent corn, flint corn, pod corn, popcorn, flour corn, and sweet corn.
- 4. The world record for the tallest corn stalk is more than 35 feet.
- 5. An acre of corn eliminates 8 tons of carbon dioxide from our air.
- 6. More than 90 million acres on earth are dedicated to producing corn.
- 7. Corn is used in non-food items like fireworks, glue, fabric, crayons, fuel, paint, laundry detergent,
- 8. The scientific name for sweet corn is Zea mays saccharate or Zea mays rugosa.
- 9. The first mechanical corn harvested was invented by Gleaner Harvester Combine Corporation in 1930.
