#### **Government Relations**

Pa Farm Bureau has seen some recent changes in new hires for leadership positions in the Government Affairs and Communications division.

Justin Clapper who has been a Regional Organization Director is now the manager of this division. We are very fortunate to bring on board two new faces to this critical area. Bailey Thumm is the new Federal Affairs Specialist and therefore our main lobbyist in Washington DC. Kyle Kotzmoyer is our new State and Local Affairs Specialist who is our important lobbyist in Harrisburg.

Recently both Bailey and Kyle had an opportunity to show how busy both have been by having a legislative update session with all interested Farm Bureau members. By having a virtual presentation, more folks were able to listen, watch and ask questions. In quite a few cases there were small groups that got together to share their thoughts as well during the zoom update to create more insight during the conversation period.

Highlights from the Federal area covered Climate and Sustainability, Infrastructure (transportation and broadband), Supply Chain, Livestock (beef, dairy and poultry). Major topics on the state and local level focused on Conservation, Meat Processing, Solar and Alternative Energy, Stormwater and Stream Maintenance, Natural Gas and the Grain Indemnity Fund.

All of us that were tuned to this presentation learned much more about these issues and how we will, as members, continue to support progress in these areas of concern.

### **AG** Literacy

PA and Susquehanna County Farm Bureau continue to support Ag Literacy in our schools. Last year, the Friends of Ag Foundation came up with the idea of Agriculture Awareness Crates for elementary classrooms. Our Board, in addition to individual donations by members, were able to supply crates to each elementary school in the county.

This year, crates again will be available to every school. Along with an outside donation plus support from our Board and a few individuals, we will provide crates on other topics related to agriculture. In late September for grades K-2, the topic is Beef Cattle. In December, the focus is on Maple Syrup for grades 3-5, and in March, sheep will be the subject for grades K-2.

Each box or crate will contain an Ag accurate book, standardsbased lesson plans including whole group mini-lessons, access to printable worksheets, experiment supplies if applicable and a recipe to share.

We've received accolades from the teachers who have participated and used these materials last year in realizing the success with this program. We look forward to seeing each crate this year and those in the future.
