2022 SCFB POLICIES

- We recommend the PA Game Commission be responsible for the cost of fencing materials for farmers growing specialty crops once deer damage has been shown. Specialty crops are defined as fruits and vegetables, tree nuts, horticulture and nursery crops.
- 2. All legislative bills that get to committee must at least have a committee vote within the present session of the legislature.
- 3. The State Department of Environmental Protection to commit permanent recurring funding for stream restoration and stability programs.
- 4. Authorization for EMS volunteers to serve with minimum certification and training requirements while they obtain experience.
- 5. The development of a civics/local government curriculum to educate students about local government and increase their awareness of the structure and purpose of municipal government.
- 6. The PA Game Commission in an effort to increase interest in hunting, which has not only declined but is predicted to dramatically do so in the next decade to increase the Youth (12-16) hunting days, presently October 20-22 to October 17-22, Monday through Saturday.

LOCAL POLICIES

- 7. Continued support and interaction with our county commissioners in their work on mental health and the opioid crisis.
- 8. Continually supporting all the effort put forth by our county commissioners in dealing with the PA Dept of Transportation on improving our rural roads.
